If a mirror site is operating for profit, the main community has the Researchers from developed countries use our shadow right to disconnect the mirror site from open access libraries more often than other countries, in addition to community. the legal resources they already have. Shadow libraries accumulate journals by accessing Researchers from both developed and less developing accounts in universities with subscription to database. countries use shadow libraries. It is a way to share knowledge from the more privileged to the less privileged. Shadow libraries operate outside of U.S. and European jurisdiction area since the servers are hosted elsewhere, such as in Russia.
