I was an immigrant researcher in a university, being underpaid.

They made a documentary about our project regarding gender and technology; I was invisible.

They made me disappear.

I use unisex usernames and avatars in forums. When they realize I am a WOMAN, they speak condescending & patronizing. While a guy was fighting me aggressively about politics in the public thread, he pm-me asking for a date.

In a conference about free software,
a guy who clearly hadn't read my research started
mansplaining my article to me
-You are Young! he said.

I am an immigrant developer working in IT company. We are only two WOMEN.

In the whatsapp group they send memes with girls in bikini and vintage porn gifs. I don't fit.

I worked as a developer. I never integrated.

I was the only WOMAN in eight people.

I was an immigrant, younger, leading a very different life. I didn't fit.

I was looking for a job. I went to an event called "startup speed dating",
a company had a slide of a **WOMAN** in
underware, with the slogan:
"If you look like this and know PHP, please come
talk to us". It was **Offensive**.

In a hackerspace, I didn't fit.

I always felt as their assistant. I was perceived as a WOMAN oh wow, you know how to do this!

I was building a period tracking app and talked at a conference about it.

A guy started bragging about his work.

He was mansplaining to me how to create the best period app.

I went to a conference to talk about my work.
The guy at the door asked me:
"are you the Wife (!) of the developer?"
When I said I am a developer the guy felt ashamed.

My colleague was very **Offensive** on github. I asked if he can be more constructive in his comments. He said
"I don't know how to speak to ladies..."

I'm non-binary.

In the research lab where I work,
a colleague has two ways of treating me
depending on if I dress
feminine or masculine.
I was belittled and harassed.

In every environment, hackerspace, job,
I always feel excluded.

I don't fit in their talks. I feel invisible.

At some point, I had a stalker in tech space.

I'm trying to seem more Masculine.
